#### Minutes Draft

The Town Council of the Town of Mineral Springs, North Carolina, met in Regular Session at the Mineral Springs Town Hall, Mineral Springs, North Carolina, at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 8, 2012.

With a quorum present Mayor Frederick Becker called the Regular Town Council Meeting of March 8, 2012 to order at 7:31 p.m.

#### 1. Opening

- Councilwoman Critz delivered the invocation.
- Girl Scout Troop #1023 presented the colors and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 2. Public Comments

• Janet Ridings – 3105 Helen Drive, Mineral Springs.

#### 3. Consent Agenda

- Councilwoman Coffey made a motion to approve the consent agenda containing the following:
  - A. February 9, 2012 Regular Meeting Minutes
  - B. January 2012 Tax Collector's Report
  - C. January 2012 Finance Report

**Councilwoman LaMonica** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously as follows:

#### 4. <u>Mineral Springs Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department – Chief Donald Gaddy</u>

- Mineral Springs Fire and Rescue Department Chief Donald Gaddy handed out a graph to the town council and explained that it shows what time of the day the alarms were for last year. Chief Gaddy stated that every time somebody has a meal, the fire department goes out on a lot of calls! It peaks at 1:00 p.m. Chief Gaddy explained that he thought it was an interesting piece of information, which is the only reason he brought it to the council, so they could see when the fire department goes out.
- Chief Gaddy explained that he was here this evening to give the council the annual report. In 2011, the fire department ran a total of 739 calls using 4,464 man hours (in addition to the on-call man hours) and they spent 2,338 man hours in training; the total man hours was 6,802. Chief Gaddy gave a breakdown of the calls: first responder (medical) - 460; "1050s" (wrecks) - 73; structure fires - 40; fire alarms -56; brush fires – 51; vehicle fires – 10; gas leaks are picking up, because there are gas lines all over the place now; and they had one train derailment (529 man hours). Chief Gaddy noted that of the 56 fire alarms there were no fires. The train derailment was the biggest event the fire department had; there were a total of 56 firefighters on that call and there was probably at least that many law enforcement. CSX had twice that many people there. The county itself expended 2,000 man hours in 13 hours for that one call; this included law enforcement, fire, EMS, etc. Chief Gaddy compared calls made during 2011 to the calls made in 2010; they ran 711 calls expending 3,800 man hours and had 2,200 hours in training. There was a difference of 700 man hours in the two years, so they did run more calls [in 2011]. This year they started an intensive training program called "wild fire interface", (all of the people who live in Valley Farms will appreciate that). The class teaches you how to keep the fire away from the house – if they get there in time. The fire department is also having their normal second and fourth Tuesday night training, plus they have at least one class during the month on something else through the college [SPCC]; right now they are going through pump operation, which runs from January through August. The junior firefighter program is still going great, they have about 12 members. Chief Gaddy announced that the fire department is actively looking for new firefighters between the ages of 18 and 40, which are the ones they can train to go inside the house. They will not "run him off" if he is over 40. The fire department has been running the new squad that they bought at the first of the year and it seems to be helping them out by saving money on upkeep and fuel. They did get to check it out at one of their controlled burns to see if it would pump the water that they wanted it to pump and it did; they were able to use only that truck being supplied from an engine at the scene, which is one of the reasons they bought the squad.
- So far this year, the fire department has run 120 calls (in January and February);
   they have had 501 man hours on calls and 724 man hours on training.
- Councilwoman Critz asked Chief Gaddy if there was any reason for the spike in January and February. Chief Gaddy responded that they can't figure that out; they ran 77 calls in December, 74 calls in January and 39 calls in February. It started back up again this month with 24 calls. Councilwoman Critz asked if there was a young man or woman interested in volunteer firefighting, what are they looking at as far as training and time commitment. Chief Gaddy responded that the initial class is 248 hours, which is taught at South Piedmont Community College on

Tuesday and Thursday nights. It is a "Firefighter I" class, which is set up so that any individual can enter that series of classes at any time he or she wants; it runs year round and starts over every January. It is set up so that when the student finishes a subject, he is tested on that subject and if he passes it he will get a certification in it. Chief Gaddy thought that there were 50 different classes in it. The fire department covers the cost; all the individuals are required to do is "go to the class". Councilwoman Critz asked if they would be certified as a volunteer firefighter in the end. Chief Gaddy responded that they would be certified as a North Carolina Firefighter I. They can go on to become a Firefighter II, which is another 100 or so hours; however, the college is getting to where they are trying to teach the Firefighter I and Firefighter II as they go. If the student spends 40 hours in class, the Firefighter I to Firefighter II part of it is usually less than 80 hours. Councilwoman Critz commented that she thought it would look good on a resume as well, if somebody is both a firefighter and in a corporate world. Chief Gaddy responded that their department has sent twelve different people to different fire departments; they started at our place and then they go to a paid department. Councilwoman Critz asked about the "corporate world". Chief Gaddy responded that he guessed it would be according to what somebody is in, any kind of safety or anything like that; you have got to have some of this to get there. Councilman Countryman referred to the color analysis [graph that Chief Gaddy passed out] showing that the calls (medical and fire) are coming in around the time that people eat and asked if that was a local analysis. Chief Gaddy responded that it was just for our [Mineral Springs] district. Councilman Countryman asked if the fire department has looked at doing anything that provides information to the public to help them understand certain things about these times of the day that they may want to do differently. Chief Gaddy responded no they haven't. They instituted a program three months ago (that really hasn't got going yet) to do customer surveys and Chief Gaddy was planning on putting something like that with the survey sheet just to show them. Councilman Countryman asked if it would be helpful for the fire department if the analysis (or something like it) was communicated either on the town's website or in the newsletter to encourage people to be careful. Councilman Countryman commented that some of this has to do with cooking; people could take extra precautions at the time they are preparing meals. responded that the early morning things are usually heart attacks (maybe not heart attacks, but chest pains at least); when you have been laying there sleeping for eight hours and you jump up, things don't exactly go the way they are suppose to all the time. Mayor Becker mentioned that there was a huge call volume between 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and asked if the daytime staff has proven to be a "Godsend" to cover that call volume. Chief Gaddy responded yes, they would never have covered it otherwise, because they don't have anybody three or four days out of the week (there isn't anybody in their district). The paid staff is doing a "bang-up job". Chief Gaddy noted that he can look at all of their calls on a spread sheet that tells their average response time (from the time they get the call until they are on scene); last year their response time was six minutes fifty-five seconds. Some of those calls included is going to the other side of Waxhaw's district in 20 minutes (mutual aid calls), which can't be broken out of the format. A volunteer fire department strives to get eight minutes; Mineral Springs VFD has it down to a little less than seven minutes, so they are right in the ballpark.

#### 5. <u>Eagle Scout Project Request for Funds</u>

- Mayor Becker explained that Mr. Joey Shawley was back with a follow-up on the budget and funding request for his stone sign base project. Mr. Shawley passed out a piece of paper with his project price of \$870 on it. Councilwoman Critz asked if Mr. Shawley had a breakdown of the costs. Mr. Shawley responded yes and no, his boss "kind of" made up this amount based on him helping Mr. Shawley out; his boss is providing a lot of this stuff and has done a lot of work like this, so he just knows how much it costs. Mr. Shawley commented that he has "more like a breakdown" that he can bring back to the council. Mayor Becker responded that Mr. Shawley didn't necessarily have to come back again; he is not asking the town for this amount as his funding request, this is his total project budget. Mr. Shawley clarified that last time he gave the council a "broad" amount; this is the total project budget, which includes the stone, block, mortar and anything like that that he will be using. They will also need to transport water. Chief Gaddy told Mr. Shawley to just let him know when he needs water; it won't cost him a whole lot. Councilwoman Critz noted that this was the most costly project so far, but the materials for the other projects weren't as costly as the masonry, rock laying and stone for this project. Mayor Becker commented that the project budget reflects discounting and if Mr. Shawley is going to do some independent fundraising, he supposed that the town could give him some money. Mr. Shawley responded that he is very privileged to do this, because this is a \$1,000 range project and he has a lot of people behind him - supporting and helping. "So, it is kind of awesome that I get to do this", Mr. Shawley said. Councilwoman Critz suggested that the council do what they have done in the past and offer 50% of the project budget.
- Councilwoman Critz made a motion to approve 50% funding of Mr. Shawley's Eagle Project for the stone base for the sign at the McNeely Greenway and Councilwoman Neill seconded. Mayor Becker noted that he thought the sign base, just like the sign itself, will be funded out of the Capital Project Ordinance, because these are permanent parts of the site. This funding will not come out of the Greenway Maintenance Fund where the other Eagle Scout projects have come out of. Signage was dedicated in the construction ordinance and Mayor Becker sees no problem with the availability of affording \$435 from a budgetary standpoint. The above motion passed unanimously as follows:

### 6. <u>Consideration of Reappointing a Delegate and Co-Delegate to Centralina Council of Governments</u>

- Mayor Becker reminded the council that this was discussed last month and we just need to get an approval to swap the roles of the Centralina Council of Governments Delegate and Alternate Delegate.
- Councilwoman Coffey made a motion to approve Councilwoman Neill as the Delegate and Councilwoman Cureton as the Co-Delegate to the Centralina Council of Government and Councilwoman Cureton seconded.

#### 7. <u>Consideration of a Proclamation for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Girl Scouts</u>

• Mayor Becker announced that it is time for the council to consider a proclamation honoring [the Girl Scouts 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary] and that Troop #1023 was present this evening. We are privileged to have the group here to be part of this proclamation and to be active in Girl Scouting during this great year for scouting, which is the organization's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary year. Councilwoman Critz referred to the statement about the Girl Scouts having a responsibility for the environment and commented that there are a lot of things that can be done for maintenance and clean up if they have things they need to do for badges. Troop Leader Cynthia Pinkston responded that she had spoke with Mayor Becker about the girls earning their bronze, silver and gold awards; next year they will be doing the bronze award, so they will get with the town then. Mayor Becker read the proclamation recognizing March of 2012 as Girl Scouts Appreciation Month.

 Councilwoman Critz made a motion to adopt the proclamation and Councilman Countryman seconded. The motion passed unanimously as follows:

- Mayor Becker congratulated the organization as a whole and Troop #1023 as well. Mayor Becker shared that a couple of the leadership personnel were here last week and they made notice of the names of the town's elected officials and they commented that there were a lot of women on the town council. It was not that long ago in our nation's history when women weren't allowed to vote; things have changed. Mayor Becker believes that the Girl Scouts has equipped the women of our nation to the leadership potential that they can be capable of and that the Girl Scouts is one of the organizations that has really helped women become equal parts of society who were really not given that kind of equality not too long ago. Mayor Becker stated that he thinks that's just really a great thing and he was really quite proud to say "yes, the women run Mineral Springs and it runs pretty well". Councilwoman Neill shared that this brings back a lot of memories; she was a member of Scout Troop #554 in Memphis, Tennessee when she was growing up. It was a great experience, she developed friends and is still in communication with two women who were in her scout troop. Councilwoman Neill applauded the Girl Scouts and thanked them for being here this evening: "we are happy to honor the Girl Scouts tonight".

#### 9. Consideration of a Steeplechase Ad

- Mayor Becker explained that the annual Steeplechase Program Ad is the usual \$300, which is budgeted in as part of the town's advertising budget; however, it is subject to annual approval in case the council doesn't want to renew it.
- Councilwoman Neill made a motion to approve the Steeplechase ad and Councilwoman Coffey seconded. The motion passed unanimously as follows:

#### 10. <u>Greenway Safety Discussion</u>

• Councilwoman Critz explained that a couple of weekends ago, a family from the Brantley Oaks community (the Carmen's) were out on the greenway property and their children were considerably far ahead of their parents. There were a couple of women on horses that had dogs with them and the dogs ran after the children; the ladies weren't in control of these dogs, they kind of laughed and told the children that the dogs wouldn't hurt them. Two of the children were bitten. This just kind of brought to Councilwoman Critz's attention the fact that we need signage on our greenway along with regulations that the council establishes that are applicable

and helpful. The council should look at other greenways and what they have done. This should be done sooner as opposed to later, because we are asking a lot of people to be on the greenway and coexist safely and peacefully. Some of this is going to have its own set of complications; if you have got a mountain biker coming up and rounds a curve and there are some horses, people are going to get startled. These kinds of things are not within our control; there is no way to have any kind of perfect solution, but if there are good solutions for things that are within our control, Councilwoman Critz thought the council should consider those solutions. Councilwoman Critz stated that she thought it was reasonable to ask anyone on the greenway with a dog that they should have it on a leash; for the dog's safety as well as other individuals' safety. Councilwoman Critz explained that she and Mr. Critz have been on the greenway multiple times and encountered dogs that weren't necessarily with people, they are just out running. There is a moment in time when you don't know if it is a friendly dog or not. Although Councilwoman Critz did not have one of her dogs with her, if she had and it was not on a leash there would have been a confrontation between the animals, so it is in the best interest of the pet owners to have control of their own animals for the animals' safety. These women obviously didn't think their dogs would bite, but they certainly (in Councilwoman Critz's opinion) didn't make a responsible effort to control them. It doesn't appear that they are women in our general area, they have probably come from the Double R Ranch and we need to get some information to them. The father was very upset and did drive around in his car to either accesses of the greenway and did not see any horse trailers; therefore, Councilwoman Critz did not believe it was anyone that trailered in from outside the community. Councilwoman Critz felt it would be prudent on the town's part to let the Double R Ranch know and to move forward with our signage sooner than later. Councilwoman Coffey suggested that since Councilwoman Neill was in charge of public safety that she might "spearhead" research into this and find out what we are legally bound to do with this. Mayor Becker responded that he and Ms. Brooks have looked at rules. policies and ordinances in greenways both near and far; however, he has not spoken to Councilwoman Neill yet, but it is a good point that there could be a law enforcement interface here. Councilwoman Critz pointed out that she is in no way, shape or form wanting to see the town have a leash law for our community, she is speaking strictly policy for the greenway.

Mayor Becker commented to Attorney Bobby Griffin that they [mayor/council/attorney] have talked about things where the town wanted to establish hours of operation and policies of use, but Attorney Griffin ultimately said whenever you have rules or adopt an ordinance – who is in charge of enforcing it? Mayor Becker stated that if the town established the hours of operation from sunrise to sunset, he thought that would be enforceable: if a person is in the parking lot after dark, then somebody could call the police and say "you are trespassing". Attorney Griffin responded that the town doesn't have police (to enforce town ordinances). Mayor Becker asked, "but would [Sheriff] Eddie Cathey enforce a trespass?" Attorney Griffin responded that he doesn't in other towns. If it is a town ordinance that is going to be enforced, is it a criminal penalty, a civil penalty or a suggested rule? Is the mayor or clerk going to go out there and run them off? After some discussion, the following points were made: the county does not have a leash law, but animal control will go into "all" communities if there is a

vicious dog; the average person coming to walk on the greenway will not know how strict the enforcement is going to be and they will see the rules as a policy and abide by them; Attorney Griffin just always advocates not to do something that the town can't enforce; there is an obligation to warn of dangerous locations/spots; and there isn't a "downside" to posting recommendations/guidelines although there isn't an enforcement mechanism. Mayor Becker stated that he and Ms. Brooks would begin getting some guidelines together for the greenway use.

#### 11. Consideration of Installing a Split Rail Fence at the Greenway Parking Area

- Mayor Becker explained that as part of the landscape plan, he wanted something that is more "visual" than "blocking", so he came up with the idea that split rail was the cheapest and most rustic looking to go along those long open boundaries, so that people aren't migrating onto private property just because it is open. Mayor Becker just found out that he and Ms. Brooks will be meeting with David Grant [Union County Urban Forester] on Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. to discuss both the canopy tree recommendations and the buffering shrubs. Mayor Becker stated that "we have the opportunity to move ahead with that". If the council likes his fencing proposal, Mayor Becker will volunteer his time. Councilwoman LaMonica commented that it [fencing] was consistent with the look and feel on the sign with the natural kind of feel to it. It will also work with all the work the different scouts have done throughout the trail. Councilwoman Critz stated that it was a great idea and suggested that Mayor Becker "let us know" (as well as others) when the dates are that he will be going out there, in case they can help. Mayor Becker responded that he will look at the weather and try to make it five days, because if an auger is rented, five days is the best way to go. Councilwoman Critz commented that the ground down there is still pretty soft; it is holding moisture. Mayor Becker concurred and stated that this needs to be done in the next few weeks and hopefully we can get the trees planted while there is moisture in the ground.
- Councilwoman LaMonica made a motion to approve the fencing project and Councilwoman Coffey seconded. The motion passed unanimously as follows:

 Councilman Countryman offered that his tractor could be available on Mondays and Tuesdays.

#### 12. Consideration of Reappointing Members to the Planning Board

- Mayor Becker pointed out that Ms. Brooks provided the council with a "perfectly self-explanatory" memo [in the agenda packet] that the council would be reappointing Mr. Lewis (whom we just appointed) and reappointing Ms. Jill Lewis, and Mr. Bill Price is not going to serve on the planning board; therefore, we have another opening. Councilwoman Critz asked if Mr. Price gave a specific reason for declining. Ms. Brooks responded that he doesn't care for it, it is not his thing, but he would like to be on the Board of Adjustment and we do have an alternate opening on the Board of Adjustment.

Re: Greenway Parking Canopy Tree Plan

After meeting with Union County David Grant and Mineral Springs Zoning Administrator Vicky Brooks at the greenway trailhead parking lot, staff has arrived at the following tree planting recommendations:

- Plant large canopy trees 40 feet apart along the northern boundary of the site, approximately 4 feet inside the property boundary
- Utilize a combination of *Quercus phellos* (Willow Oak) and *Quercus bicolor* (Swamp White Oak)
- Specify "ball and burlap" trees of approximately 2.5" 3" caliber
- Plant a total of eight trees

These two tree species are native to the area and are very hardy and tolerant of a wide range of growing conditions. Both reach a mature height of 45' - 65', with a canopy spread of 40' - 45', and should be expected to live far in excess of 100 years. Mr. Clay Birch is very experienced in planting trees of this sort under conditions such as ours, and is highly recommended by Mr. Grant for the quality and reliability of his tree planting.


I have included a copy of Kevin Herring's original drawing, with the split rail fence placement indicated, and with the proposed tree placement added. The estimated cost is as follows:

This project would be accounted for in the Greenway Parking Area Capital Project Ordinance. These trees should be billed to the "Landscaping and Signage" category. We have committed \$1,870 to the sign and the stone sign monument out of a total allocation of \$6,000 to this category in the project ordinance, leaving a current balance of \$4,130. This will cover the tree purchase and planting with \$1,970 remaining for additional landscaping and signage.

The zoning administrator has confirmed that this tree planting plan satisfies the requirements of the Mineral Springs zoning ordinance for canopy tree requirements in parking areas.

I would recommend that council approve this tree planting project at a cost not to exceed \$2,200.00.

**Subject:** Update on greenway guidelines and safety issues

At the March 8, 2012 meeting, council briefly discussed possible rules, regulations, and safety guidelines for our greenway. I have been working to compile some of the ideas that were brought up during that discussion, and provide some preliminary guidelines based on that discussion. Attorney Griffin reminded council that whenever rules are established, it is essential to include a strategy for enforcing those rules.

Since the town does not have a police department, the consensus was to initially establish "guidelines" for the greenway rather than "rules". Based on citizen feedback, possible violations of use guidelines, and unexpected problems that may arise as the trails experience higher user volume, council will be able to "fine-tune" the guidelines and determine what sort of enforcement is available and practical, and how the rules can be codified.

As part of this developmental process, I have prepared a preliminary "Trail Map and User's Guide", which is attached. I have spent a lot of time recently working on the trails and the parking area, and as such have come into contact with many trail users. I have found that we are already experiencing a surprisingly high volume of visitors. The most frequent complaint I have heard has been that some of the routes are unclear or confusing, especially to newcomers who are unfamiliar with the layout of the trails. Therefore, I thought that it was important to make a usable map available immediately, and include with it some of the guidelines we have discussed. Since council has not adopted formal rules by means of an ordinance or even by motion, I have not prepared any permanent signage and have included the word "preliminary" in two places in the user guide. I have made copies of this "Preliminary Edition" of the Trail Map and User's Guide available in an information box at the McNeely Road trailhead, supplies of which I will replenish as needed if council approves.

I expect that our Trail User's Guide will be a work in progress for a few months, and after council has formalized the town's greenway policies – and after some additional work is done on the trails themselves – we can update and reissue this brochure as the "Official" Trail Map and User's Guide". I will also be working on alternatives for a trailhead information kiosk and for permanent signage to present to council for approval. My experience with trail users has so far been very positive. There has been no littering or other abuse; in fact, some users actually have picked up and removed litter if they encountered any. Several visitors have brought dogs, and *all* have been on leashes. I have heard no safety concerns or complaints about user conflicts.

I ask that council review this preliminary guide and make any suggestions on changes or improvements.

### **Sheriff's Office Enforcement**

I recently met with Sheriff Eddie Cathey and Captain Cody Luke and asked them about enforcement of greenway hours of operation. Sheriff Cathey informed me that the Sheriff's Office would be happy to assist the town with that sort of enforcement. The town would need to adopt a resolution stating the hours of operation and authorizing Sheriff's Deputies to enforce those hours. If C-Com received a call about suspicious after-hours activity, or if a deputy on normal patrol encountered people or vehicles on the greenway property after-hour, the deputy would inform the persons that they must leave or be subject to arrest.

Residents of Harrington Hall and McNeely Farms will be most aware of potential signs of trouble such as headlights entering the parking area after dark. As with our other Neighborhood Watch recommendations, these residents should call "911" and report such suspicious vehicles.

As we discussed last month, the Sheriff cannot enforce municipality-specific policies such as a leash requirement. However, Sheriff Cathey *did* confirm that any "regular" crime on greenway property, such as assault, would be treated as a similar crime anywhere in the county, and Sheriff's Office personnel would respond to and investigate such incidents.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE UNION COUNTY SHERRIFF'S OFFICE TO ENFORCE GREENWAY HOURS OF OPERATION AND REQUESTING SUCH ENFORCEMENT R-2012-02

WHEREAS, the Union County Sheriff's Office provides law enforcement services to the Town of Mineral Springs, enforcing state laws and county ordinances within the town; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Mineral Springs has established a greenway system, consisting of trails and trail-related parking facilities located on property owned by the town; and

WHEREAS, the town has established hours of operation of its greenway and parking facilities to be from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset; and

**WHEREAS,** the town has declared its greenway facilities to be "closed to the public" outside of those designated hours; and

**WHEREAS,** in the interest of promoting public safety, the sheriff's office has expressed its willingness to assist the town in the enforcement of these operating hours;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town of Mineral Springs hereby authorizes the Union County Sheriff's office to enforce the hours of operation of the town's greenway facilities, and hereby requests that the Union County Sheriff's Office direct any members of the public to vacate those facilities during the nighttime period more particularly described as being between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.

The map and guidelines in this brochure are preliminary and are subject to change. Trails are still under development, and not all routes are fully marked. Please exercise care while enjoying our greenway!

Yellow Trail: This is the main trail on the Mineral Springs Greenway. The yellow trail begins at the McNeely Road trailhead, and closely follows the Wolf and Bates Branches. Markings are either yellow wooden arrows or painted diamonds on trees. Total trail length is just under two miles. The yellow trail currently ends at a dry creek near the northernmost portion of the greenway property. Note: trail may not be marked after first mile, but it is still very easy to follow.

Blue Trail: This short trail begins in the Copper Run subdivision, and connects to the yellow trail approximately 3/4 mile from the McNeely Road trailhead. The blue trail consists of a 1/2-mile loop at the western end, and a 1/4-mile straight trail that joins with the yellow trail. There is also the "Blue-Yellow Connector", another short trail that connects the blue and yellow trails.

There are three picnic areas as shown on the map, as well as several benches and horse hitching rails in other locations along the trails.

Several of the bridges do not have permanent ramps at this time, and may be challenging for beginner mountain bikers. Please use these bridges with care!

Be ready to encounter a few muddy areas in the winter and spring, and after heavy rains. Please be careful not to damage the trail with mountain bikes or horses at those times!

**Conservation By Design** 

Welcome to the Mineral Springs Greenway!

Our trails are open to hikers and joggers, mountain bikers, and horseback riders. Please observe the following guidelines for safe and enjoyable trail use:

- No motorized vehicles
- No hunting or shooting
- Dogs are welcome, but please keep them on a leash
- Trails, picnic areas, and parking lot are "Pack supplies in...Pack trash out". Please don't litter!
- Please do not create new or cut-through trails
- For maximum safety, hike or ride with a partner
- Treat wildlife with respect; this is their home!



Re: Agenda Item #12 – Consideration of a Carolina Thread Trail Sign

**Subject:** Interlocal Tax Collection Agreement with Union County

As you probably already know, Libby Andrews-Henson will be announcing her retirement as Mineral Springs Tax Collector at the April 12, 2012 meeting. She will be retiring as of June 30, 2012. I hope all of you share my great appreciation for Libby's work over the past 13 years. She will be a tough act to follow!

With those thoughts in mind, I decided that now was a good time to revisit the idea of entering into an agreement with Union County to collect Mineral Springs property taxes. As I see it, we have two alternatives: 1) interview candidates and fill the position of Tax Collector with a new part-time staffer, or 2) give the idea of county-facilitated tax collection a try.

If council decides to enter into a collection agreement with Union County for fiscal year 2012-2013, the Town of Mineral Springs will still be responsible for collecting all "back taxes" that were due for fiscal years prior to that: ie, 1999 – 2011. Council would need to appoint a Tax Collector with the specific duties of delinquent tax collection, charge that person each year with the balance of taxes due, and have that person bonded as the Tax Collector is now. Deputy Clerk and Office Assistant Janet Ridings has expressed interest in taking on those duties on her current hourly basis, subject to any additional hours per week that would be required for the collection duties. I would continue to provide IT and data processing support for the delinquent tax collection process. It is my opinion that the delinquent tax collection duties could be accomplished with an average time commitment of ten hours per month, which should gradually decrease over future years.

Based on my discussions with Robin Merry in the Union County Tax Administrator's office, and with Vann Harrell, Union County Tax Collector, I see several advantages to utilizing the county's services:

- Union County would charge 1.5% as a collection fee. The town's current tax levy is approximately \$66,000, which would incur a collection fee of approximately \$990.00. These fees are charged as tax is collected, and deducted from the monthly direct deposit.
- Union County would be responsible for everything related to tax collection; the Mineral Springs tax would appear on taxpayers' Union County tax bills, and Mineral Springs would not need to do any printing or mailing
- Prior year tax collection would be the county's responsibility from 2012 forward
- Union County utilizes both wage/salary garnishment and the North Carolina debt setoff program to collect past due taxes, and would do so for the Mineral Springs portion of taxes due; these methods have been very effective, but the town itself hasn't utilized these programs because they are difficult to set up and administer

• The most recent Mineral Springs annual budget amount for Tax Collection has been \$11,544; I estimate that, including the costs of delinquent collection that the town would have to bear, the total budget amount for county tax collection would be:

County Fees \$1,000 Staff Cost (delinquent) \$1,500 Billing Expenses (delinquent) \$300 **Total Budget** \$2,800

This would represent an annual budget savings of \$8,754.

- Union County would be responsible for the delinquent tax advertisement and the costs associated with that advertisement
- All releases and duplicates would be processed through the county, and would not need to be approved by council on a consent agenda
- County reporting has improved, and council will be receiving the same level of detail that has been provided by Libby
- Closing attorneys and tax escrow services would have one point of contact Union County –
  and would have better access to real-time tax information for the years the county is
  responsible for
- Current administrative staff will not be required to hire and train a new tax collector

The disadvantages I see to utilizing the county's services are:

- Council no longer has 100% control over the tax collector; council's authority is limited to the terms of the interlocal agreement with Union County
- Taxpayers will *not* be able to make any current-year payments directly at the town hall; there are a few taxpayers who seem to have taken a liking to paying in person, and they would lose the availability of that convenience

When this decision came up several years ago, the number of disadvantages was close to the number of advantages. However, just the fact that turning over tax collection to Union County would eliminate the need for the town to conduct a tax-collector search is a huge advantage by itself. I think that we were very fortunate to have had the benefit of Libby's accounts-receivable expertise since the town's founding, and that we would be hard-pressed to find a person with similar qualifications who would work on such a limited part-time basis.

Also, it is a fact that even the few taxpayers who like to pay here in person also must make tax payments to Union County. Whenever they decide to travel to Monroe to pay the county portion of their bill, they will be able to pay their Mineral Springs tax on the same trip.

I have included a few documents from Vann Harrell of Union County:

- A sample monthly report (current and several prior years)
- A sample annual settlement (current and prior years)
- A "blank" generic interlocal agreement

If council is interested in pursuing this arrangement with Union County, Mr. Harrell can arrange to have somebody attend an upcoming Mineral Springs town council meeting to answer any questions. In any case, council must make its decision no later than the June 2012 meeting.

#### INTERLOCAL AD VALOREM TAX BILLING AND COLLECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made as of the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2008, by and between the **TOWN OF** <<**Insert Name**>>, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of North Carolina ("Town"), and UNION COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina ("County"). WITNESSETH: WHEREAS, the Town of << Insert Name>> and Union County have the power pursuant to General Statute §153A-445(a)(1) and Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes to jointly exercise any function which they have been granted the power to exercise alone, or to contract with the other for the exercise of any governmental function which they have been granted the power to exercise alone, and to enter into contracts or agreements to specify the details of these joint undertakings; and WHEREAS, the Town of << Insert Name>>desires for Union County, by and through its duly appointed Tax Administrator, to list and assess municipal properties, both personal and real, for the purpose of levying ad valorem taxes; and WHEREAS, the Town of << Insert Name>>desires for Union County, by and through its duly appointed Tax Administrator, to bill and collect current and subsequent delinquent municipal ad valorem taxes by methods set forth in Article 26 of Chapter 105 of the North Carolina General Statutes: and WHEREAS, the Town of << Insert Name>>by action of the Town Council dated the , requested the County to list, assess, bill, and collect current and subsequent delinquent municipal ad valorem taxes; and WHEREAS, Union County, by action of the Board of County Commissioners, dated the day of \_\_\_\_\_, has agreed to list, assess, bill, and collect current and subsequent delinquent municipal ad valorem taxes; NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants of the parties as set forth herein, the Town of << Insert Name>> and Union County agree that the Agreement is stated in its entirety as follows:

1. LISTING, ASSESSING, BILLING, AND COLLECTION OF TOWN AD VALOREM TAXES AND CURRENTLY ASSESSED FEES: The County shall serve as the tax collector for the Town in the listing, assessing, billing, and collection of ad valorem taxes and currently assessed fees, beginning with the fiscal year which commences on July 1, 2008. Currently assessed fees are those that appeared on the Town's latest tax bills delivered prior to the date of this Agreement, except as otherwise agreed by the parties pursuant to Paragraph 3. The County will not be responsible for the collection of any delinquent ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest, or previously assessed fees for any years prior to the commencement date of this Agreement. The Town agrees to fully

cooperate with the County in the listing, assessing, billing, and collection process, including any assistance needed in determining situs issues and in discovering property which should have been listed for taxation pursuant to N.C.G.S § 105-312.

- 2. MOTOR VEHICLE TAXES AND FEES: The responsibility of the County to list, assess, bill, and collect ad valorem taxes on registered motor vehicles, as defined in N.C.G.S. §105-330.3(a)(1), and the fees paid by the Town for such services, as well as the fee for collection of any annual license tax imposed pursuant to N.C.G.S. §160A-213, shall remain the same as set forth in N.C.G.S. §105-330.5(b) and shall continue to be handled without changes to the current process unless deemed necessary by the County. The County will also be responsible for the listing, assessing, billing, and collection of unregistered vehicles as defined in N.C.G.S. §105-330.3(a)(2), and the fee for such services shall be calculated in the same manner as set forth in paragraph 8.
- 3. BILLING AND COLLECTION OF NEW MISCELANEOUS FEES AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS: This Agreement acknowledges that the Town has the authority to levy miscellaneous fees and other special assessments upon the residents and businesses within its jurisdiction that can potentially be added to the ad valorem tax bill. However, the Town, in accordance with this Agreement, shall not levy any new miscellaneous fees or special assessments with the expectation that said fees or special assessments will be added to the ad valorem tax bill without prior consultation with the County Tax Administrator for the purpose of ensuring proper billing protocol is followed and software capabilities for handling such fees and special assessments are reviewed and deemed adequate. Any such fees or special assessments levied in accordance with State law shall be subject to a separate addendum to this Agreement with a separately negotiated billing and collection fee schedule.
- **4. COUNTY AUTHORITY:** The County shall have all of the authority as set forth in the Machinery Act (N.C.G.S. §105-271 through 395.1) and other statutory provisions in the process of listing, assessing, billing, and collecting Town ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest, and fees.
- 5. ALLOCATION OF RECEIPTS: At the end of each calendar month, the County will analyze the month's deposit of funds collected to determine the dollar amount of ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest, and fees which are allocable to the Town. On or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day of the next month, the County will remit to the Town, via electronic funds transfer (EFT), the Town's share of the ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest and fees collected for the previous month. Any discrepancies that are found after the remittance date will be adjusted in the next remittance date for the Town.

In addition, for the months of November, December, and January, on the sixteenth (16<sup>th</sup>) day of each month, the County will remit to the Town, via EFT, all ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest, and fees collected and allocable to the Town during the first fifteen (15) days of each month. The remittance of all ad valorem taxes, penalties, interest, and fees collected and allocable to the Town from the sixteenth (16<sup>th</sup>) day to the end of each month during these same months shall be remitted in the manner described in the previous paragraph.

- 6. MONTHLY COLLECTION REPORTS AND ANNUAL SETTLEMENT: A collection report detailing all ad valorem taxes and miscellaneous fees collected, discovered, and released will be provided to the Town on or before the fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) day of each month for the period ending with the last calendar day of the previous month (see attached Exhibit A as to the form of the monthly collection report). The annual settlement required under N.C.G.S. §105-373 will be provided to the Town on or before the last day of July for the previous fiscal year during which collections were made (see attached Exhibit B as to the form of the annual settlement).
- **PRIORITY OF ALLOCATION FOR PARTIAL PAYMENTS:** If a partial payment of a tax bill is made, the County will apply that payment in accordance with its standard priority schedule. Any tax due to the Town after applying the priority schedule shall be deposited to the benefit of the Town in accordance with paragraph 5.
- 8. **FEES TO BE PAID BY THE TOWN TO THE COUNTY:** The Town will compensate the County for the services provided in this Agreement on a percentage rate equal to one and one-half percent (1.5%) of the total amount of ad valorem taxes, penalty, interest and fees collected by the county on behalf of the Town in accordance with this Agreement.

In addition to the above fee, the Town will compensate the County for collection of any new miscellaneous fees and special assessments as required by any associated addendums in accordance with Paragraph 3 of this Agreement. The County will calculate the fees to be paid pursuant to this paragraph and deduct the same from the County remittance to the Town made on the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day of each month pursuant to Paragraph 5.

- **9. TOWN ANNEXATIONS:** In the event the Town annexes property at any time other than July 1 of a given year, the County shall not be responsible for collecting prorated ad valorem taxes resulting from the annexation. The Town shall be responsible for notifying the County at a reasonable time prior to any annexation in order to allow the County sufficient time to assess and bill the ad valorem taxes resulting from the annexation.
- **10. TERMINATION:** The Town or the County shall have the right to terminate this Agreement effective July 1 of each year, beginning with July 1, 2009. The decision to terminate shall be made by the respective governing bodies of the Town and the County. Notice to terminate must be given in writing no later than March 1 of any year.

### 11. MISCELLANEOUS:

(a) All decisions involving discoveries, garnishments, attachments, and other collection proceedings are delegated to the County. The County agrees to use its best efforts in accurately listing, assessing, billing, and collecting Town ad valorem taxes and any associated miscellaneous fees. The County will not be held to a higher standard for collection than it has for collecting County ad valorem taxes.

- (b) The Tax Collector of the County is, by this Agreement, designated as the Tax Collector for the Town. All duties of the Town Tax Collector for the collection of the ad valorem taxes and miscellaneous fees to be collected by the County, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §105-349 through 378, are transferred to the County Tax Collector.
- (c) The Town shall adopt the same schedule of discounts, if any, as adopted by the County pursuant to the provision of N.C.G.S. §105-360(c), and shall adopt a resolution directing the Town not to collect minimal ad valorem taxes pursuant to N.C.G.S. §105-321(f).
- (d) This Agreement may be amended in writing at any time by mutual agreement of the parties.

**Subject:** FY2012-2013 Budget: Preliminary Departmental Appropriations

The accompanying spreadsheet shows the FY2010-11 final budget and actual expenditures, the FY2011-12 current budget and estimated final actual expenditures, and suggested appropriation levels for the FY2012-13 budget.

This "first draft" suggests an *decrease* of \$10,144 over the current year's operating expenditure budget, or 3.9%. This figure, as usual, reflects no changes in staff salaries. Council should decide whether or not to apply their customary increases in these salaries; historically, council has approved 3% across-the-board increases. Note that the "Assistant/Deputy" position is given a \$10,500 budget amount; this is not a salaried position, and the \$10,500 is a maximum suggested allocation for the position. Currently, this position requires 12 hours per week, corresponding to the time the town hall is open for regular business hours. The hourly rate for this position is currently \$12.00.

### **Reading the Chart**

In the right-hand column, headed "2012 proposed", bold-faced numbers are the totals within each budgetary department. These numbers add up to the total of \$252,257. These are the categories that ultimately end up in the adopted budget ordinance and within which the town must operate; numbers within these departments are "flexible", and may be increased during the fiscal year as needed without budget amendments as long as the departmental totals in the ordinance are not increased. Salaries are shown in white, at the same amount as the current year. The three figures in the "dotted" cells are simply sub-subcategories within subcategories.

### **Major Increases**

- 1. "Park and Greenway Maintenance": now that some trails are actually being developed, the trailhead parking area is open and nearly complete, and the trail committee has been formed, we will be spending more on upkeep. Increased from \$2,400 to \$3,600.
- 2. "Charities, Agencies": we historically exceed this line item slightly above the budgeted \$8,500; the proposed increase more accurately reflects actual expenditures. Increased from \$8,500 to \$10,300.
- 3. "Employee Overhead": if council increases salaries, there will be some increase in the overhead items that are based on salary. Also, cost of benefits is scheduled to increase slightly. Increased from \$21,900 to \$22,900.

### **Major Decreases**

- 1. "Elections": This being a non-municipal-election fiscal year, we will not be liable for the cost of an election. Decreased from \$4,200 to \$600.
- 2. "Salary Assistant/Deputy": If council decides to outsource tax collection to Union County and assign delinquent tax collection duties to the Deputy Clerk, as recommended, a small portion of the Deputy Clerk's hours will be attributable to Tax collection, and has been moved to "Tax Collection" for budgetary purposes. Decreased from \$12,000 to \$10,500.
- 3. "Tax Collection": Since our salaried tax collector is retiring at the end of FY2011-12, council will be considering the option of outsourcing tax collection functions to Union County. If council takes this recommended action, tax collection costs will decrease substantially.

  Departmental decrease from \$\$11,544 to \$2,800.

Most line items and even most departmental appropriations remain unchanged for FY2012-13. The budget amounts approved by council in recent years appear to be representing the town's overall spending priorities quite well, and as such there is no need to modify those budget amounts.

At the April 12, 2012 meeting, council should consider two items related to the budget: decide on salary numbers including possible cost-of-living increases for next year, and advise the budget officer of any changes council wishes to make to the other appropriations so that the formal proposed budget may be presented to council in May.

Re: Agenda Item #15 – Consideration of Requesting Bids for Town Hall Landscaping and Maintenance

The Town of Mineral Springs entered into a General Lawn and Shrub Agreement with Hummingbird Lawn Care in July of 2009. That agreement was effective from July 20, 2009 to June 30, 2010 and has not since been renewed; however, it has been honored on a month to month basis. Since, the original agreement has long since expired; it may be time for the council to consider requesting bids from several landscapers.

There are many areas on the town hall site that are in desperate need of "professional" landscaping and an ongoing maintenance plan.

The Scope of Services should include at a minimum:

- Mowing on a weekly basis during the growing season.
- Edging with a mechanical device to obtain a neat straight edge around curbs, sidewalks, the building, trees and planting beds.
- Removing all debris from the town hall site on a weekly basis year round. Debris includes leaves, sticks, pinecones, rubbish, paper, bottles, cans, rock, gravel, etc. The debris shall be removed from the town hall site.
- Use of a blower or sweeper to keep the parking lot and sidewalks free from foreign material (dirt, trash, grass clippings, pinecones, sticks, etc.)
- Insecticides shall be used to control red ants on an "as-needed" basis.
- Spring and Fall fertilization.
- Spring and Fall aeration and reseeding the Spring reseeding may be eliminated once the fescue grass has established itself.
- Additional needs will be presented to town staff for consideration (i.e. liming, weed control)
- Shrub pruning to keep a neat appearance.
- Mulch all plant beds and keep the free of weeds. Inspections and maintenance shall be performed on a weekly basis.

I will continue to work on the Scope of Services to prepare for the bid process.
